Case management from a clinical social worker, evidence-based modality for individual counseling and group therapy from licensed professionals, mealtime fellowship, on-site chapel, opportunities for medical/dental resources, future walking trails, trade skills/education and daily prayer time are part of the remarkable and comprehensive support plan.

Women of all faiths or no faith are welcome, but the Catholic environment is designed to add peace and enhance spirituality in residents' lives.

Research-oriented approaches shown to produce positive outcomes will be the foundation of treatment to reduce anxiety and improve emotions and coping abilities in moms who are struggling. St. Mary's Home for Mothers is not a band-aid fix, but a life enriching opportunity. "Give a man a fish, and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish, and you feed him for a lifetime."


