Staff Spotlight: Ruby Hamline Client Advocate



A co-worker described you as a Client Advocate who is "the glue." What role do you play at SMHM?

My role at SMHM is to be support for the Executive Director, other staff, and our residents. I perform clerical duties, I am the keeper of the gate, help with food service duties, wash dishes, provide transportation, and even provide childcare if needed.

Please share about your personal and professional background?

The single most important thing to know about me is that I am a follower of Jesus Christ. He is my Lord and Savior, eternal King, Redeemer, and friend. I am a sinner saved by His grace and strive every day to love Him more, serve Him more, and know Him more. I was born in Kansas City but grew up in small towns in Missouri, Kansas, and Texas.
